
FANTASY - REALMS OF THE IMAGINATION

BURMA TO MYANMAR

Thursday 2nd November 2023 - Sunday 11th February 2024

From influential superpower to repressive regime, Myanmar – also known as Burma – has seen dramatic fluctuations in fortune over the past 1,500 years. Experiencing decades of civil war and now ruled again by a military dictatorship, Myanmar is an isolated figure on the world stage today, and its story is relatively little known in the West. However, the extraordinary artistic output of its peoples, over more than a millennium of cultural and political change, attests to its pivotal role at the crossroads of Asia.

7 DEATHS OF MARIA CALLAS | MARINA ABRAMOVIĆ

Friday 3rd - Saturday 11th November 2023

As the prima donna of the 20th century, Maria Callas has long fascinated internationally renowned performance artist, Marina Abramović. Now, Abramović's celebratory opera project, 7 Deaths of Maria Callas, receives its UK premiere.

The deaths of 'the Tigress', as Callas was called, are recreated featuring some of the arias that were most important to the singer. In the production of *7 Deaths of Maria Callas*, Marina Abramović and co-performer Willem Dafoe will die seven times in seven films. Seven singers including Sarah Tynan, Elbenita Kajtazi, Nadine Benjamin, Eri Nakamura, Aigul Akhmetshina, Karah Son and Sophie Bevan perform well-known arias by Bellini, Bizet, Donizetti, Puccini and Verdi while Abramović herself appears on stage.

Israeli-American conductor, Yoel Gamzou, makes his ENO debut after premiering the production in Munich, Athens, Berlin, Paris, Amsterdam and Naples. The opera will also include new music arranged by Serbian composer Marko Nikodijevic. This staging marks 100 years since the American-born Greek soprano's birth.

BEETHOVEN'S FIFTH

Wednesday 29th November 2023 | Royal Festival Hall

Some composers make their own rules, and with just four notes, Beethoven's Fifth Symphony reset the agenda for Western music.

It's a timeless tale – defiant, impetuous, and as gripping now as it was in the age of revolution: worthy musical company, in other words, for two women who defied impossible odds. Leonore, the courageous heroine of Beethoven's only opera, is a fictional character. But the pioneering African American composer Florence Price was absolutely real, and LPO Leader Pieter Schoeman steps into the spotlight to bring her neglected Second Violin Concerto to vibrant, songful life tonight.

THE CREDIT SUISSE EXHIBITION: FRANS HALS

Saturday 30th September 2023 - Sunday 21st January 2024

Four hundred years since they were painted, Frans Hals's portraits still breathe with life. Hals gained prominence for pioneering a unique portrait style characterised by relaxed, animated subjects often smiling or laughing, diverging from the norms of his era. This retrospective exhibition, the first in over three decades, showcases around 50 of Hals's masterpieces, including the famed 'Laughing Cavalier'. Organised in collaboration with the Rijksmuseum, Amsterdam, and the Gemäldegalerie, Staatliche Museen zu Berlin, the exhibition aims to reintroduce Hals's significant contribution to Western art, encompassing a range of his works, from intimate pieces to grand group portraits, reuniting marriage portraits and genre scenes from global collections.

Launched as a response to the cost-of-living crisis, the Gallery will be extending its Pay-What-You-Wish scheme, allowing people to visit the exhibition on Friday evenings for as little as £1.

WILDLIFE PHOTOGRAPHER OF THE YEAR

Friday 13th October - Sunday 30th June 2024

Every Autumn, the Natural History Museum unveils its annual Wildlife Photographer of the Year exhibition, featuring 100 remarkable photographs that illustrate the precious beauty of our planet.

This year, WPY59 will open to the public on 13th October, showcasing the winning entries from the 2022 competition. The world's oldest and most prestigious wildlife photography competition, for its fifty-ninth iteration it attracted an astounding 49,957 entries from photographers of all ages and experience levels from 95 countries.

The exhibition brings to life a global showcase of emotive images, from animal portraiture and photojournalism to urban wildlife and underwater worlds. A forest rodeo, a hidden stargazer and a mason bee at work are just a few of the awe-inspiring images featured this year.

MARINA ABRAMOVIĆ

Saturday 23rd September 2023 - Monday 1st January 2024

Marina Abramović at the Royal Academy of Arts is one of the hottest tickets in London's autumn culture calendar. The exhibition presents key moments of the performance artist's 50-year career, through sculpture, video, installation and live performance. Works such as *The Artist is Present* is strikingly re-staged through archive footage while others such as *Imponderabilia* is reperformed by the next generation of performance artists, trained in the Marina Abramović method. Experience it for yourself until New Years' Day, 2024.

About the artist: <u>Marina Abramović Hon RA</u> has earned worldwide acclaim as a performance artist. She has consistently tested the limits of her own physical and mental endurance in her work, subjecting herself to exhaustion, pain and even the possibility of death.

IMPOSTER 22 BY MOLLY DAVIS

Saturday 23rd September - Saturday 14th October 2023

Seven friends are in the frame for murder and the police are closing in. They must clear their name and in order to do so, they've enlisted the most unlikely of help.

As the pressure mounts, friends become suspects and the experience changes them all. This funny, dark whodunnit will take you on an unexpected journey; with jokes, sex, songs, crimes, plot twists and a comeuppance.

Developed collaboratively over five years by Access All Areas' learning disabled and autistic Associate Artists: Kirsty Adams, Cian Binchy, Housni Hassan (DJ), Dayo Koleosho, Stephanie Newman, Lee Phillips and Charlene Salter alongside writer, Molly Davies and director, Hamish Pirie, Imposter 22 is a playful account of navigating barriers, neurodiversity and the power of sharing a platform.

JEPHTHA. THE ROYAL OPERA

Wednesday 8th - Friday 24th November | Main Stage

Jephtha's devotion to God is unshakeable. But when he unwittingly vows to sacrifice his own daughter, he will test the bonds of faith – and family – to the limit. Continuing our odyssey into Handel's Covent Garden works, this gripping new staging by Oliver Mears sheds powerful new light on a timeless biblical tale. Allan Clayton (*Peter Grimes*) returns to Covent Garden in the title role, joined by a largely British cast including Alice Coote, Brindley Sherratt and Jennifer France, with musical direction from baroque specialist Laurence Cummings.

CHRISTO AND JEANNE-CLAUDE: BOUNDLESS

Monday 15th November - Monday 22nd January 2024

As part of its Season of Sculpture, Saatchi Gallery announces *Christo and Jeanne-Claude: Boundless*, an upcoming co-headline Winter exhibition, showcasing the largest retrospective of the renowned artist duo Christo and Jeanne-Claude ever in the UK.

Tracing their artistic journey, from experimental beginnings in Paris across six decades of collaboration, the exhibition showcases rarely seen works and offers a glimpse into future projects to be undertaken by the estate of the artists.

Christo and Jeanne-Claude: Boundless introduces visitors to the couple's seminal projects, ranging from their early collaborations to monumental masterpieces, among them Wrapped Coast in Australia (1969), Surrounded Islands (1983) in Miami/Florida, The Pont Neuf Wrapped in Paris (1985), and The Umbrellas (1991). This exhibition is the last to ever be signed off by Christo before his death and is divided into ten thematic chapters.

Journey through the unrealised dreams that shaped their legacy, with insight into The Mastaba (project for Abu Dhabi). Larger than the Great Pyramid of Giza, this visionary concept stands as a testament to the enduring impact of Christo and Jeanne-Claude's expression and drive.

DIVA celebrates the power and creativity of iconic performers, exploring and redefining the role of 'diva' and how this has been subverted or embraced over time across opera, stage, popular music, and film. Showcasing over 250 objects drawn from the V&A collection and loans from across the world, the exhibition explores the powerful and personal stories of creativity, ambition, and resilience of some of the best-known divas, from opera goddesses and silent movie stars to sirens of the big screen and today's global megastars.
